7. New Business

1. Randomization of Relays

- Daniel led a discussion about changing shooting partners & targets every relay when possible
- Exact squadding in advance may not always be necessary
- Blind pre-squadding an option (e.g. squad by number and given each shooter a random number day of match)

2. Scorekeepers

- Daniel led a discussion on scorekeepers; dedicated scorekeepers were used at all major events in 2021
- Dedicated scorekeepers is a lot of work, but matches ran easier
- A cheatsheet/quick reference guide could be distributed to scorers for use while scorekeeping

3. Match Organization

- Daniel led a discussion on match organization
- 3 relays are preferred when shooters also have to be a dedicated scorekeeper, as it is less pressure and easier pace to the matches
- A break between 2 relays could be used instead of 3 shooting relays
- Published start times should be adhered to
- Everyone acknowledged that it is important to respect Match Organizers and ROs, who are volunteers and often doing the best they can
